**Committed** (*NBC, TV-14*) Nate mistakes Marni's friend for a therapist. He should have figured it out when she let him talk for more than 50 minutes.

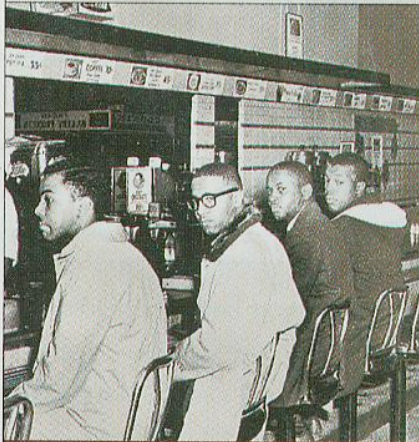

**February One: The Story of the Greensboro Four** (*PBS, TV-PG-LV*) February 1, 1960 could easily have been the day the Civil Rights Movement ended. With no momentum in African Americans' fight for human rights, four students from North Carolina A&T State University staged a sit-in at the segregated Woolworth's lunch counter in Greensboro, N.C. *February One* documents how their peaceful protest led to not only the integration of the store, but inspired sit-ins in 54 other cities around the country. Especially interesting are interviews with white eyewitnesses, including a college student who joined the protest. *February One* isn't the most passionate film about the era, but it adds a worthy chapter. **B**
